The Sailing Museum welcomes you to a new school year filled with creativity and curiosity.

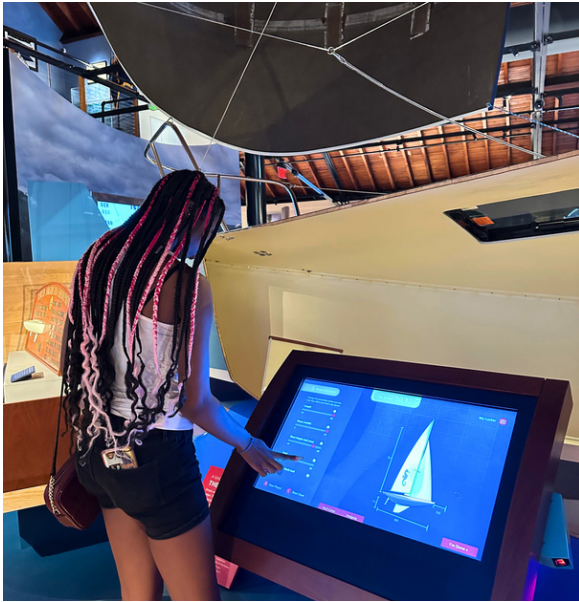
Magic happens when wind and water meet. We invite you and your students to test your skills at sailing and explore the history of the sport through interactive exhibit experiences.

Wind & Water

Personalize your museum journey by selecting a boat and setting off on an adventure! Begin with the basic elements- wind and water- and discover what happens when they meet. Learn about points of sail, ocean stewardship, the anatomy of a boat... and try your hand at designing your own boat.

Teamwork

Sailing brings people with assorted skills together, working towards a common goal. Whether cruising or racing, teamwork is essential to making a boat sail swiftly. Learn about the collegiate sailors making their mark and team up with your friends to race to the finish.



Making of a Sailor: Mental

Through hands on activities, students will discover the array of technologies and innovations of sailing and be challenged to develop new ideas.

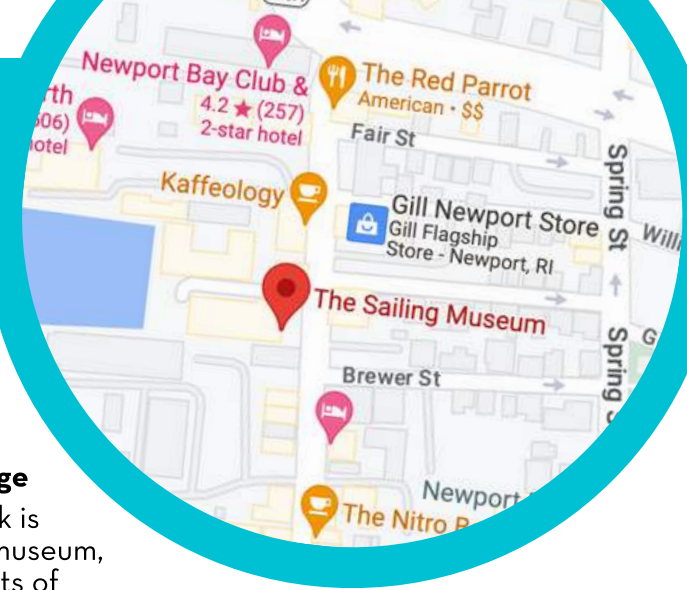


History
